#### What We Do?

JAG-NM transforms communities. one student at a time. by reengaging academically vulnerable high school students and preparing them to reach their potential through graduation and beyond.

JAG-NM places a highly trained teacher (Specialist) in every JAG classroom, whose job is to create a customized student experience that encompasses academic, social, and emotional support and preparation for college, career, and life through our community-based network.

**JAG-NM** provides comprehensive training for specialists and students, hosts events at both state and national levels, and manages the JAG-NM Career Association. We also maintain a robust network of employer partners.

This comprehensive approach aims to strengthen partnerships and enhance our students' career readiness.



JAG-NM is an education-based. participant-centered nonprofit offering a continuum of support.

JAG partners with high schools to serve the most vulnerable high school students (grades 9-12) through graduation, and then one year of follow-up to support participants as they transition into post-secondary education and training pathways.

By partnering with public education and private businesses, JAG ensures these participants become thriving members of our nation's workforce.

# STUDENT EVENTS & MILESTONES

JAG-NM students showcased outstanding dedication and leadership throughout the year, excelling at both local and national events.

#### October 2023: State Student Leadership Conference

Students engaged in leadership, teamwork, and career development activities, connecting with peers, mentors, and industry leaders.



In Washington, D.C., students attended leadership workshops, participated in service activities, and represented the future of New Mexico's workforce.

#### January 2024: JAG Day at the State Legislature

50 students met with Senator Bill Tallman and Lt. Gov. Howie Morales, advocating for youth policies and building civic leadership skills.

# March 2024: New Mexico Career Development Conference (CDC)

Over 300 attendees, 15 employers, and 9 competitions helped students refine skills like public speaking, resume writing, and interview techniques.

#### **April 2024: National Career Development Conference (NCDC)**

JAG-NM's 39 participants earned major wins, including:

- 3 Outstanding Chapter Awards
- 5th Place in Career Preparation
- 8th Place in the LOVE Project
- Alondra Aguilera made history as New Mexico's first National Career Association Officer, serving as Secretary.

**NEW SITES** 



The 2023-2024 School Year saw four new successful JAG sites throughout New Mexico: Alamo-Navajo Community Schools, Zuni High School, Carlsbad Career Enrichment Center, and Gallup-McKinley Career Opportunity Center.

NCDC



This year New Mexico sent 39 people in attendance to NCDC, the largest number in our history. We brought back 3 Outstanding Chapter wins, a 5th place win for Career Preparation, an 8th place win for the LOVE Project, and our first elected National Officer.

**TRANSITION** 



This year marked a series of significant milestones for JAG-NM, including our first transition in Executive Directors and Program Managers. We also introduced a new Employer Engagement position, welcomed five new Specialists, and implemented a new database provided by JAG National.
